After her arrest, Moore was arraigned before District Judge David Brian of Landisville, who released her on \$25,000 unsecured bail.

Clerk charged in Turkey Hill heist BY PATRICK BURNS

Police say a man charged in a 2006 armed robbery of an East Petersburg convenience store had an accomplice: the store clerk, who handed the gunman more than \$600.

Manheim Township police Monday filed charges of theft and false reports against Gregory L. Shorter, 26, a former clerk at the Turkey Hill, 5959 Main St., which was robbed June 18, 2006. Police say Shorter, whose last known address is West James Street, conspired to rob the store with Anthony G. Taylor Jr. In April 2007, police charged Taylor as the masked gunman who robbed the Turkey Hill of \$629. But investigators were unable to interview Taylor until last week because he was already incarcerated at a prison outside the area.

Taylor's interview led to charges being filed against Shorter, police said. But investigators long ago had suspicions about the clerk, according to Manheim Township police Sgt. Thomas E. Rudzinski.

First, though, police had to find the gunman. That happened when investigators were able to match Taylor with clothing found near the store a few days after the crime.

The clothes, which matched the description of those worn by the suspect in the robbery, were sent to the Pennsylvania State Police laboratory for DNA analysis. The test results revealed that the clothing belonged to Taylor, police said.

Confronted with the evidence, Taylor implicated Shorter, who he said had agreed to split the the money with him, police said. Rudzinski said police became suspicious of Shorter after looking at the store's surveillance tape of the robbery. He said convenience stores typically don't let that much cash accumulate in a till before making a deposit in the store safe.

Shorter also appeared to be able to open the register with "a one-button punch; usually it takes several punches to open a register," Rudzinski said.
