He was preceded in death by two sons, Frank C. and Dale E. Hynicker and a brother, Irvin O. Hynicker.

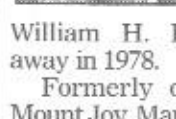

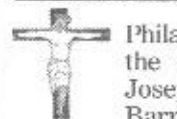
Born in Rapho Township, she was the daughter of the late John T. and Ella Zeager Frey.
