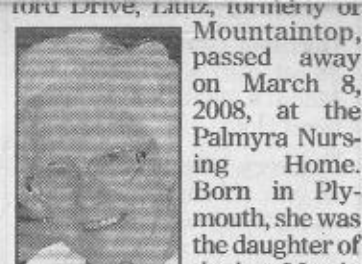

Supermarket exec found slain in home

Info sought in death of Gary Redner

PHILADELPHIA — A supermarket executive was killed in his home over the weekend, but police in Berks County offered few clues Monday about whether the slaying appeared random or targeted.

Gary W. Redner, 55, helped his family run Redner's Wholesale Markets, a regional chain founded by their father. Police believe he was killed between 7 p.m. Saturday and 6 a.m. Sunday.

Redner served as executive vice president of the Reading-based company, which operates 39 grocery stores and a dozen convenience stores.

"My son was extremely

popular. If he had an enemy, I don't know who he was," father Earl Redner, 82, said Monday. "He was probably the most popular person in the company, and that includes me."

Earl Redner, now retired, said he last spoke to his son Saturday from Charleston, S.C., where he lives part-time. Gary Redner seemed in good spirits and did not voice any particular concerns, his father said. They did not discuss his son's plans for

the day.

Gary Redner, who was divorced with two adult children, was found dead Sunday at his stately red brick home in Lower Heidelberg Township. He lived alone, according to his father.

An autopsy was performed Sunday, but police did not disclose the cause of death.

"He was a very gregarious man. We would like to think that anyone who knew him professionally or personally, and may have some kind of direction or suggestion, that they would contact us," said Lt. Thomas McDaniel, who runs the criminal investigation unit at the state police barracks in Reading.

He declined to say whether there was a break-in at the home or if anything was missing, and would not say who discovered the body.

"We don't want to expose anything that would undermine investigators," McDaniel said.

Gary Redner was the company's executive vice president of procurement and director of wholesale operations. His brother, Richard E., also of Lower Heidelberg Township, serves as president, chief executive officer and chairman of the board of directors.

Gary Redner's son, Gary M., joined the company in 2001 and directs wholesale operations while Richard's son, Ryan, is chief operating officer, a company spokesman said.

Gary Redner is also survived by a daughter who does not work in the family business, spokesman Eric B. White said.

Redner's has about 4,000 employees. The company, which added the family name to Earl Redner's independent markets in 1979, operates stores in eastern Pennsylvania, Maryland and New York state.

Pa. state college system head leaving for post in Virginia

FREDERICKSBURG, Va. (AP) — The chancellor of Pennsylvania's State System of Higher Education is leaving to become the president of the University of Mary Washington.

Judy Hample was selected as the new president on Monday by the Board of Visitors of the Fredericksburg school. She has been chancellor of Pennsylvania's 14-campus, 110,000-student public university system — which includes Millersville University — since August 2001.

Hample said in a statement that she was drawn to the school for several reasons, including "its impressive history, its public mission and its vision for the 21st century."

She succeeds William Frawley, who was fired by UMW's

Board of Visitors nearly one year ago, after he was charged with driving under the influence twice in a two-day span. He was later convicted of the charges in Fredericksburg and in Fairfax County.

Hample's appointment as Mary Washington's eighth president is effective July 1.

Can you please explain ways that might help me get off oral cortisol? I am currently taking 22.5 milligrams daily. Almost every time I drop the dose, even by as little as 1.25 milligrams every other day, I get the beginning symptoms of an adrenal crisis (sweating, nausea, vomiting, abdominal pain, diarrhea, extreme fatigue and profound weakness). I take extra cortisol when this happens, and I usually start to feel better within 30 to 45 minutes.

During one of these episodes, I noticed that my skin looked tan even though I had not been out in the sun. What

caused by medical treatment) is one of the most common forms of adrenal insufficiency. It is caused by excessive or chronic use of glucocorticoid medication (such as prednisone), which essentially reduces adrenal function or shuts down the adrenal glands. Your doctor should have known and told you about the possible risks of long-term prednisone use and offered ways to reduce the risk of adverse effects.

To the best of my knowledge, your adrenal glands will not resume normal function, necessitating supplemental cortisol for the rest of your life. Without normal levels of cortisol, your body cannot function properly. This can lead to serious consequences, including death, if proper amounts of cortisol are not taken. Your endocrinologist is the best person to answer your concerns. He or she will know more about the condition and treatment than I.

As for your tan skin, that is caused by cortisol deficiency. It should have disappeared after taking the extra cortisol.
