Two brothers, Henry Cassel, aged 86, and Abraham Cassel, aged 79, and one sister, Mrs. David Kauffman aged 82 years, met, by appointment, and in all human probability for the last time on earth, and attended Mennonite meeting. These three old persons are the only children their parents ever had. Mr. Henry Cassel is the oldest citizen of Marietta, and was accompanied on this—his last trip away from home, by his estimable daughter, Miss Lizzie Cassel, whose many kind offices to the sick and needy will long be remembered.

On the 15th ult., near Millin, Ohio, Anna, wife of Benjamin Staman, aged 73 years, 5 months and 8 days.

Mrs. Staman was born near Lancaster, Lancaster county, Pa., November 7, 1804. She was a daughter of Dr. John Kaufman, of that place. Dr. Kaufman with his family emigrated to Ohio in the spring of '27 and settled in Richland county, four miles west of Millin, where he practiced his profession up to the time of his death, which occurred in 1845. He left a family of six children (three boys and three girls), of which Anna was the third. On the 17th of February, 1831, she married Benjamin Staman, who, with his parents, also emigrated from Lancaster county, Pa., to Richland (now Ashland) county, in 1825, and settled on Kuffner's Run, near the village of Petersburg, now Millin. Here she lived with her husband, sharing with him all the hardships and privations of pioneer life, gaining by their industry and frugality a considerable competence. Their union was blessed with five children (four boys and one girl) only two of which survive her—John K., who lives on the old homestead, and Christian C., who lives on a farm adjoining. Mrs. Staman had been an invalid for twenty years, suffering more or less during that time from disease of the lungs. Through all these years she bore her suffering with great patience. During the last three weeks of her life she was confined to her bed suffering extremely. She often expressed a desire to be released from this tenement of clay and dwell where there is no pain, no suffering; and when the messenger, Death, came she was ready to obey the summons of her Master, and thus she passed peacefully away. By her death her husband loses an affectionate wife, her children a kind mother, and the community a benevolent neighbor and friend. Her doors were always open to the worthy poor and none were turned away from her house empty. She was highly esteemed by all who knew her, and her death leaves a void that cannot be filled. A few days before she died she was baptized and received the communion, and departed in the expression of a confident hope of a better life. Her remains were followed to the grave by a vast concourse of friends and neighbors, so that the spacious audience room of the Lutheran Church of this place could not contain them, and many were obliged to remain outside during services. The funeral services were conducted by Rev. John A. Hall, of the Lutheran Church of this place, assisted by Rev. C. S. Ernsberger, of Lucas.—Mr. Hall preached an impressive sermon from Psalms, 90: 12—"So teach us to number our days that we may apply our hearts unto wisdom."—*Mansfield Herald*.

THE LAST LINK BROKEN.

Death of Tobias K. Miller in Cumberland County.

Mt. Joy Star and News.

Tobias K. Miller, formerly of this neighborhood, died last Thursday, near Bowmansville, Cumberland county, in the 89th year of his age. His great-grandfather Miller was born in Switzerland and came to America shortly after the time of the Reformation, when the Zwinglian or Reformed church was established in Switzerland. He had to flee from the country on account of his faith, after he had united with the Mennonite church, which was then sorely persecuted and not tolerated under the government. He settled in Lancaster county, near Lancaster, where he died and left a widow, one daughter and four sons. Tobias Miller, his grandfather, married Barbara Brubaker. They had three sons, of whom his father, Benjamin, was the oldest. They all died in Lancaster county. His grandfather, Tobias Miller, died in the 61st year of his age. Mrs. Miller died in her 81st year. His father, Benjamin Miller, died in his 54th year. His mother in her 72d year. Her maiden name was Kauffmar, and her mother was a Miss Long. All these were also buried in Lancaster county, near the Little Chieques creek, Rapho township. His brother, Benjamin, died near Midway, Ohio, aged 68 years. His sister, Nancy, was married to And. Hiestand, of E. Donegal township, and died at the age of 83 years. Susan Miller, another sister, was married to Christain Greider, of Hempfield, and died at the age of 58 years. Mary Miller was married to Jacob Nissley. She died in Cumberland county, at the age of 75 years. Barbara Miller was married to Jacob Garber, and died at the age of 60 years. Elizabeth Miller was married to John Stauffer of Penn township.

The information concerning this large and well-known family was furnished us by John M. Hiestand, of this place, who gathered the above facts from a memorandum kept by Tobias K. Miller, deceased.

His remains were taken to their last earthly resting place on the 17th, followed by a large concourse of relatives and friends who thus showed their last tribute of respect to one who had many years lived amongst them; Impressive discourses were held by Messrs. Bomberger, Longenecker, & Hostetter, Text, 1st verse 6th chapter, Prophet Hosea.

Auf den Tag, als die Verstorbene ihr 19tes Jahr erreicht hatte, stand sie des Morgens, allem Anschein nach in vollkommener Gesundheit auf. Nachdem sie mit der Familie gefrühstückt hatte, wollte sie ihrer Mutter in der Haushaltung an die Hand gehen, und war kurze Zeit in einer anstoßenden Stube beschäftigt gewesen, als man sie einen schwachen Schrey ausstoßen hörte. This is an account of the last hours & death of
David Kauffman of Warwick Township Lancaster Co.
State of Pennsylvania.

He had intencel to have some locust trees felled for posts in the
third week of Jan^y - 46 this being about the proper season & in the old moon;
In the morning of Jan^y 15th 1846 he enjoyed his usual health which was
very good considering his age; both his health & appearance at this time
gave hopes to his family & friends that he might tarry with them a number
of years, but an alwise providence had ordained otherwise! of the trees
to be felled one stood near his stable & also near a fence & it seemed necessary
to cut off several limbs to fell it safely so as not to do any damage.

He had always evinced a fondness for climbing & trimming ^{trees} & was very
handy at it. Altho' he was getting old still took pleasure in doing it, when
frequently advised to quit it & leave it to others.

on said day after dinner he took a ladder to the said tree & ascended it
for the purpose of cutting off some limbs, his daughter Anna in going to
the tenants house [Belmor] noticed him on the tree & said Father, I am
afraid you will fall down he replied O I think not. About two O'clock
I came there & was alarmed to see him up so high he was then about
thirtyfour feet up had finished what he intencel to do there, he was sitting
in the forks of the tree resting & looked tired I felt very uneasy about his
safety I asked him whether he was not tired he replied yes to be sure it makes
one tired I said you ought not to have gone up so high & told him to throw
down the small axe but he wanted to cut off something below yet. I tried
to hurry or urge him down without shewing alarm & while he was thus
resting there I felt as if he would not get safe down that tree, he now com-
mencel descending a difficult stretch of about ten feet & down it as handily

as any young person could, I now felt more easy & had hopes that all would go right he was now on the lower limb about 24 feet from the ground & some distance from the ladder, there was a fork [a small branch formed it] in the limb near the trunk & a tolerable good place to sit, here he seated himself apparently for the purpose of resting & also to cut off a branch of the limb [an other branch he had cut off on going up] he had lightly struck the axe in & said here I thought to cut it off we were thus talking there was a fence between me & when the tree stood I had my eyes on him & in a moment he appeared senseless something had got over him his head was drooping & he falling; he came down like a dead man & fell pretty much on his head I was there in a few moments the blood was gushing from his nose & there was hardly a sign of life with the exception of an ^{occasional} involuntary gasping for the space of about ten minutes his pulse also beat about that long we brought him under the roof of his dwelling before all signs of life were extinct, the left part of his forehead, eye & temple turned blue, but for the hat no doubt he would have been bruised worse. It was the opinion of Drs Garber & Dunlap that the skull was not broken nor the neck dislocated: to all appearance the fall would have been enough to destroy life, but whether any thing else had come over him that would have caused his end is only known to his maker.

The hour appointed for his funeral was on Saturday the 17th Jan^y 46 at 1 O'clock P.M. it was wet on the ground & snowing yet notwithstanding the inclemency of the weather an unusual large number of sympathizing relatives, friends & acquaintances assembled on the mournful occasion to show their last tribute of respect to one who had so long lived amongst them. Improvised discourses were delivered by Christian Longenecker, Christian Bomberg & Jacob Hostetter.

Text 6th Chapt. 1st verse Prophet Hosea.

Before the discourse commenced several verses were sung from the Hymn commencing "Wer weis wie nahe mir mein ende" This hymn he so frequently sang during the last years of his life. While his corpse was placed before the house & the coffin closed an verse was sung & an other read from the Hymn that commences "Gute nacht ihr mein liebste"



The following is an account of the last days & hours of Maria Kuffmann widow of Penn formerly Marwick daughter of Lancaster Co. Pa.

Some 18 months previous to her death she took a spell of sickness after which she never regained her usual strength & from that time on was mostly confined to bed sometimes sitting in her rocking chair not being able to stand on her feet, her sight gradually failing until toward the last she was blind & thus shut out of the world, as a general thing during her long confinement she did not suffer much pain but lingered on with changes, old age doing its work by gradually weakening her constitution. On Saturday Feb. 11th she took a vomiting spell which weakened her so that she could no more recover not having an appetite to eat which continued to be good before. on Sunday 10th she became somewhat restless which continued until Monday March 11th 1867 about noon up to this time she would answer questions sensibly from this time on she lay quietly & it was evident that her end was approaching & without any apparent severe struggle breathed her last
