Born in Brooklyn, NY, he was

the loving husband of June S. Dubroff. They were married for 53 years and renewed their vows on their golden wedding anniversary in 2004 in front of family and friends. He was the son of the late Maxwell and Tillie Simons Dubroff.

Mitchell served with the United States Merchant Marine as a Hospital Apprentice 1st Class from 1945-46 and then enlisted in the United States Army, where he served until 1947. He served as a PFC Medical Technician and Military Police Officer at Camp Lee, VA, and Fort Lawton, Wash. He was a recipient of the World War II Victory Medal.

He received his B.A. in Psychology from New York University in 1950 and his B.S. in Pharmacy from Brooklyn College of Pharmacy, L.I.U. in 1954. He was the owner and supervising pharmacist at Marcy Pharmacy in Queens, NY until 1972 where he was renowned for his dedication to his customers and his monthly "penny sales." He was instrumental

in the Tylenol recall of 1982, and often served as an expert witness for the State of New York in cases pertaining to State Education laws. Following his retirement in 1995, he served as a consultant with Professional Pharmacy Services, based in Freehold N.J.

His greatest pleasures included bicycling with his family, carpentry in his basement workshop, listening and singing to music, and learning new languages. He was a history buff, with a special interest in World War II, an avid reader of fiction and non-fiction alike, and a crossword aficionado, a gift he passed along to his daughter Marcy, with whom he often read the dictionary to learn new words. He loved animals, especially his dogs, and was an enthusiastic collector of antique apothecary jars. However, he derived the most enjoyment from spending time with his family, whether it was taking walks down to his beloved Sheepshead Bay, or piling the kids into the car for his legendary "Sunday drives" along the Belt Parkway.

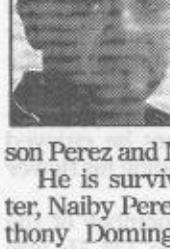

Patients need to insist on answers

DEAR DR. GOTT: I am amazed at the experiences of some of your readers who appear to have very incompetent physicians. The people are complaining of an ailment, yet the doctors don't seem to take the time to do testing to determine the cause or to refer them to a specialist.

I used to think this happened only to older people, where some doctors may not be concerned. However, I just read about a 28-year-old woman who has pain in her lower abdomen

and her doctor tested her only for a urinary-tract infection. I had a similar problem and had many tests to rule out cancer. Do you think it has to do with the type of insurance a patient has?

DEAR READER: Yes and no. Many of my questions come from readers who are either too afraid or too embarrassed to ask their primary-care physicians. Or, as is often the case, they have asked time and time again to no avail.

Doctors can have a bad day, as can anyone. A visit you've waited days or weeks for with great anticipation turns out to be a waste of time, and you know less than when you got to the doctor's office. When this occurs, it is time to clear the table, ask straightforward questions and request straight-

forward answers. Tell your physician if you are dissatisfied with the visit and need better responses. If you have tried this and you are still unhappy, request a referral to another physician or specialist.

You are correct that older people often appear to be misdiagnosed or are not listened to by some doctors. When a senior doesn't get a fair shake, can't be understood or is simply confused about medications, perhaps a change to a geriatric specialist is appropriate.

Insurance and managed-benefit programs are often a major consideration. A patient might demand to know everything but refuse to undergo any testing, or, in the case of managed benefits, might be restricted in what can or cannot be performed. When these issues occur, a physician is put on the spot and must gather all diagnostic skills to make an appropriate decision and recommend treatment based solely on symptoms and a patient history.
