Bishop Clarence Lutz Of Elizabethtown, Die

Bishop Clarence E. Lutz, 69, assistant moderator of the Lancaster Mennonite Conference, died unexpectedly at 4:35 a.m. Monday at his home at 621 N. Hanover St., Elizabethtown. He had been under the care of a physician.

He was the husband of the late Ruth L. Lutz, who died Aug. 4, 1972.

Bishop Lutz was the founder of the C. E. Lutz Inc., oil and tire distributor in Elizabethtown.

He was ordained to the Christian ministry in June 1937, and in February of 1950 he was ordained a bishop for the Elizabethtown District of Lancaster Mennonite Confer-
