College defends porn filters

LATROBE (AP) — St. Vincent College has blocked pornography and gambling Web sites from residence hall computers since August 2006, but some on the Roman Catholic college's campus say they learned of it only recently.

Jim Towey, the college's president and former director of the Office of Faith-based and Community Initiatives with the Bush administration, introduced a policy of filtering out the sites on those computers shortly after taking office.

The filtering was not announced, and some say they were unaware of it before the appearance late this fall of fliers posted anonymously on campus and a blog by Towey defending his decision.

Towey said the proliferation of pornography, some hardcore and violent, is degrading and potentially addictive to those who view it.

"I realize that we are in the minority of Catholic colleges and universities, but I like where we are," he said, according to the Pittsburgh Post-Gazette.

"I think our Catholic identity and mission compel us to give this witness to our students that our community is not going to be complicit in this spreading of pornography."

Towey said he has received dozens of supportive comments, but also noted he had critics, including someone who has been posting fliers on the campus of 1,900 students asking, "Is Mr. Towey our parent, or the college president?"

The idea arose in July 2006, three weeks after Towey arrived from the White House. A memo from the school's dean of students about computer misuse on campuses — particularly the downloading of pornography — sought Towey's authorization to use vendor-supplied software to filter out that material.

Towey said he weighed the moral and academic implications with campus monks, professors and administrators be-

William F. Ganong, 83, expert in brain's control of body

William Francis Ganong, 83, a former chairman of one of the leading physiology departments at an American university and one of the first scientists to trace how the brain controls important internal functions of the body, died Dec. 23 at his home in Albany, Calif.

The cause was prostate cancer, his wife, Ruth, said. Ganong, a neuroendocrinologist, was chairman of the physiology department at the University of California, San Francisco, from 1970 to 1987. When he took over the department, neuroendocrinology — the science of how hormones and glands interact with the nervous system — was just becoming part of medical school curriculums.

The brain and the body were taught separately, and the basic science of the nervous system "was still a mystery," said Michael Stryker, a professor of physiology and a successor of Ganong as chairman of the UCSF physiology department.

"He assembled a department that was regarded as one of the best in the world," Stryker said of Ganong, "and its particular strength was neu-

roscience."

In 1982 and again in 1986, the UCSF physiology department was rated first in the nation in a survey by the National Academy of Sciences.

Ganong taught classes in all of his department's disciplines, including respiratory medicine, cardiology and neuroscience. He also encouraged faculty members, including scientists he had recruited to do basic research, to teach classes beyond their specialties. At the same time, working in his laboratory, Ganong made several breakthroughs. He was one of the first scientists to realize that much of the action of the endocrine system is regulated by the brain.

He was born July 6, 1924, in Northampton, Mass., one of two children of William and Anna Hobbet Ganong. His father was a doctor, and his mother was a geologist.

In 1955, Ganong was hired as an assistant professor at the University of California, Berkeley. Three years later, he moved to the University of California, San Francisco, to help start a research program in physiology. He retired in 1999.

Irene Reid, 77, singer, bandleader

NEW YORK — Irene Reid, a singer who toured and recorded with Count Basie's band and appeared on Broadway in "The Wiz," died on Jan. 5 in the Bronx. She was 77.

The cause was cardiac arrest, said Wendy Oxenhorn, director of the Jazz Foundation of America, which had been helping to provide Reid with health care for more than a decade.

A jazz vocalist whose style was heavily laced with elements of gospel and the blues, Reid never achieved as much success as contemporaries like Dinah Washington and Esther Phillips who took a similar approach. But she worked steadily and finished her life on a high note with a surprising career resurgence.

Born in Savannah, Ga., on Sept. 23, 1930, Reid began singing in a church choir there and moved to New York in 1947 to pursue a singing career. After winning the Apollo Theater's amateur contest several times, she spent two years with the Dick Vance band at the Savoy Ballroom in Harlem before going out on her own.

She joined the Basie band in 1961 and stayed for a year, then formed her own small group, Irene Reid and Company, and recorded two big-band albums for Verve, one of the leading jazz labels of the period. But probably her most prominent job in the post-Basie years was on Broadway, where she briefly joined the cast of "The Wiz" as the wicked witch Evillene, the role originated by Mabel King.

She is survived by a daughter, Gwendolyn Reid; four sons, Michael Leon Redfield, Bernard Redfield, James Raymond Reid and Gregory Reid; 13 grandchildren; and nine great-grandchildren.

HARRISBURG (AP) — A soldier has died in Texas from combat injuries he suffered in Afghanistan, the Pennsylvania Army National Guard announced Sunday.

Berrettini, a nurse practitioner, had volunteered to serve in Afghanistan. In civilian life, Berrettini was a Port Allegany High School nurse.

He joined the Pennsylvania National Guard in 1984 and was a former active-duty sailor.

"He was a very good man, very professional, somebody they trusted," retired teacher Ron Caskey, a former colleague of Berrettini's, said.

Tony Flint, Port Allegany superintendent of schools, said Berrettini had been an elementary school nurse for seven years before becoming a nurse at the high school, where he also worked for seven years.

Berrettini, who died at Brooke Army Medical Center, is survived by his wife, Jane; his mother, Doris; a brother, Nello; and two sons, Vincent, 26, and Christopher, 22.
