American film director Jules Dassin, 96, made 'Never on Sunday'

Director Jules Dassin is seen with his wife, Greek actress Melina Mercouri, on Nov. 22, 1960. Dassin died late Monday at an Athens, Greece, hospital, officials said. He was 96.

ATHENS, Greece (AP) — American director Jules Dassin, whose Greek wife Melina Mercouri starred in his hit movie "Never on Sunday" and six more of his films, died late Monday at an Athens hospital, officials said. He was 96.

The cause of death was not made public. A spokeswoman for Hygeia hospital said only that he had been treated there the past two weeks.

Dassin, a leftist activist whose more than 20 films also included "Topkapi," abandoned Hollywood in 1950 during the Communist blacklisting era.

Five years later, he won wide acclaim for "Rififi," famous for a long heist sequence that was free of dialogue. The movie won him the best director prize at the Cannes Film Festival, where he met Mercouri.

He married the actress-politician in 1966 and settled permanently in Athens. Dassin directed his wife in seven films, including 1960's "Never on Sunday," in which she gained international notice for her portrayal of a kindhearted prostitute.

Reacting to news of the di-

His 1974 film "The Rehearsal" was based on the Greek student rebellions that helped bring down a 1967-74 military junta that had forced Dassin and Mercouri into exile in Paris.

In 1980, Dassin made the Canadian-backed film "Circle of Two," starring Richard Burton as an aging artist with a romantic fixation on a teenage student, played by Tatum O'Neal. Dassin was disheartened by its weak box office performance and never made another film.

Born Dec. 18, 1911, in Middletown, Conn., to a Jewish barber who emigrated from Russia, Dassin was raised in working-class neighborhoods around New York.

He joined New York's Yiddish Theater in 1936 and wrote adaptations of theater plays for radio.

After moving to Hollywood, Dassin worked as an assistant to Alfred Hitchcock on "Mr. and Mrs. Smith." A year later, he directed his first film, "The Tell-Tale Heart" based on an Edgar Allan Poe short story. He moved on to make films at MGM, Universal and 20th Cen-

"Greece mourns the loss of a rare human being, a significant artist and a true friend," Karamanlis said in a statement. "His passion, his relentless creative energy, his fighting spirit and his nobility will remain unforgettable."

After Mercouri's death in 1994, Dassin focused on her main unrealized goal while she was Greece's culture minister: trying to persuade the British Museum to return the Elgin Marbles, a large collection of sculptures taken from the Parthenon by a Scottish diplomat nearly 200 years ago.

"If there is anything I want to be remembered for, it is for fulfilling Melina's dream," he told The Associated Press in a 1997 interview.

Dassin's Hollywood credits include "Reunion in France," a 1942 wartime romance with Joan Crawford and John Wayne; "Brute Force," a 1947 prison drama starring Burt Lancaster; and the 1948 detective thriller "The Naked City."

After meeting Mercouri, he began to build his career around her. In 1974, Mercouri gave up acting after being elected to the Greek parliament as a fiery Socialist. She became culture minister in 1981 and served in the post for more than eight years, setting her sights on returning the 2,500-year-old Parthenon sculptures to their homeland. After his wife's death, Dassin created the Melina Mercouri Foundation to continue her work.

Dassin's funeral arrangements were not immediately available. He had expressed a wish to be buried alongside Mercouri in central Athens' First Cemetery.

Angus Fairhurst, 41, member of 'Young British Artists' group

LONDON (AP) — Angus Fairhurst, one of the group of "Young British Artists" who stormed the international art scene in the 1990s, has died, a spokeswoman said Monday. He was 41.

Erica Bolton said Fairhurst committed suicide Saturday during a walk in a remote part of Scotland.

Born in 1966 in Penbury, southern England, Fairhurst studied at London's Goldsmiths College in the 1980s, where his contemporaries included Damien Hirst, Gary Hume and Sarah Lucas.

They and their work — first exhibited in the 1988 exhibition "Freeze" — were central to the group of provocative and playful young artists. Patronage by collector Charles Saatchi and intense media attention brought riches and fame to several of the group, notably

Hirst and Tracey Emin.

Fairhurst had a lower profile, but his paintings, sculptures and installations were exhibited around the world.

His work was included in the 2000 "Apocalypse" exhibition at the Royal Academy. In 2004, Fairhurst, Lucas and Hirst collaborated on the "In-A-Gadda-Da-Vida" show at Tate Britain.

Fairhurst's last show was at London's Sadie Coles gallery last month.

Fairhurst "made some of the most engaging, witty and perceptive works of his generation and was an enormously influential friend of other British artists who came to prominence in the early '90s," said Tate director Nicholas Serota. "We shall all miss him greatly."

Hirst said Fairhurst was "a great artist and a great friend."

Sean Levert, 39, part of R&B group LeVert, dies after falling ill in jail

CLEVELAND (AP) — Sean Levert, a third of the 1980s R&B trio LeVert and son of lead O'Jays singer Eddie Levert, has died after falling ill while serving a jail term. He was 39.

Authorities said Monday that an autopsy was inconclusive but foul play was ruled out.

Levert was sentenced last week to one year and 10 months in jail for failing to pay \$89,025 in child support. He died at Lutheran Hospital in Cleveland late Sunday, less than an hour after he was taken there from the jail, said coroner Frank Miller.

Levert was sentenced by Cuyahoga County Common

Pleas Judge Nancy Margaret Russo, who said a presentence report indicated he had been addicted to marijuana from the time he was 14 until recently. He didn't speak at his sentencing and gave no indication of any health problems, the judge said Monday.

His brother Gerald Levert, who had success as a solo artist

after leaving their trio, died in 2006 at age 40 of an accidental mix of prescription and over-the-counter drugs.

Their hits included "Baby I'm Ready," "(Pop, Pop, Pop, Pop) Goes My Mind" and "Casanova." "Casanova" was nominated for a Grammy in 1988 for best R&B performance by a duo or group with vocal.
