WILLIAM H. HINKLE

William H. Hinkle, of Columbia, dropped dead Friday afternoon in front of his home. Death was caused by valvular disease of the heart. He was a Civil War veteran and a retired Pennsylvania Railroad employe. His death occurred on his seventy-second birthday anniversary. During the Civil War he served an enlistment as a member of Company F, 195 Pennsylvania Volunteers. For a period of thirty-eight years he worked for the railroad company. His wife and the following children survive: Mamie M. Hinkle, Mrs. Edna Depew and William Hinkle, all at home. Gladys Depew, a granddaughter, also survives. Funeral services will be held this afternoon at 2 o'clock at the house.

ABRAM SLOAD

Abram Sload, a prominent contractor of Maytown, died yesterday afternoon at his home. Death was caused by a stroke of apoplexy sustained last Tuesday. He was a son of the late John and Lydia Sload, of Akron, where he was born August 28, 1842. His father was a miller, and when the deceased was yet a boy moved to Maytown to take charge of Wolgemuth's mill in Donegal township. About the year 1860, Mr. Sload was married to Miss Charlotte Welscham. Three children were born of this union, one survives, Warren Sload, of Maytown. During the year 1862 he enlisted in Company K, 135th regiment, Pennsylvania Volunteers. He was honorably discharged after serving a nine months enlistment, and again enlisted as a corporal during March, 1865, in Company B, 214th regiment, Pennsylvania Volunteer infantry. During July, 1880, he was married a second time, his bride being Miss Helen Markley, one son was born, who is Paul Sload, of Elizabethtown. His wife, two sons, and a brother, Samuel Sload, of Maytown, survive. Ten grandchildren and three great grandchildren also survive. He was a member of the Maytown Reformed church since 1898, where he was a member of the consistory, serving as a deacon and later as an elder. He was also assistant superintendent of the Sunday school for a number of years, and for a period of two years was its head. Funeral services will be held Monday afternoon at 2 o'clock from his late home, and at 2:15 o'clock in the Maytown Reformed church. Interment will be made in the church cemetery.
