Harry Lefever, Bloomingdale Founder, Dies

Harry B. Lefever, 1925 Sterling Place, owner and developer of Bloomingdale in Manheim Twp., died Sunday at 6 p. m. in the General Hospital after an illness of three weeks. He was seventy-two.

The Bloomingdale development, located in the northeast quadrant of the Roseville Road-Lititz Pike intersection, was begun by Lefever more than 30 years ago and now includes more than 150 homes.

Since the late 1940's, the 115acre plot has been more intensively developed through Engle & Hambright, Inc., agent for Lefever. Bloomingdale has recently been extended to the Oregon Pike.

Born in Manheim Twp., a son of the late Christ M. and Fannie Brubaker Lefever, he was formerly engaged in farming and continued to work a small plot on his farm before his illness.

He was a member of St. Peter's Lutheran Church, Neffsville.

Surviving are his wife, Myra Hess Martin Lefever, and three step-children, Myrtle, wife of Curtis A. Thomas, York; Pauline, wife of William Fletcher, Chevy Chase, Md., and Melvin H. Martin, Silver Springs, Md.
