When Garden Spot High School graduate Andrew "Bull" Nolt's ankle began to bother him during his senior basketball season, he played through the pain.

But when that pain lingered into springtime baseball season, an exam and a bone biopsy revealed alarming news. Nolt had Ewing's Sarcoma, a rare and aggressive form of bone cancer.

A year later, the 20-year-old is still courageously fighting the disease — but not without a little help from friends.

to help Nolt and his family pay for medical expenses. "Hoops for Hope" will take place from 2 to 8 p.m. today at Garden Spot High School, 669 E. Main St., New Holland.

"It seemed like an ideal kind of thing to hold. He played basketball here, and the gym was here to use," said Chrissy Tay-

lor, a senior basketball standout at Garden Spot.

Taylor co-organized the event with fellow senior Chelsea Usner. Money raised will go to the Andrew T. Nolt Fund to help defray the cost of his chemotherapy and radiation treatments at Johns Hopkins in Baltimore.

"We wanted to do something that could help the family out and get the community involved," Taylor said.

In April, the Nolt family suffered another setback when Andrew's older brother, Adam, sustained head injuries in a motorcycle accident. He is currently in rehabilitation.

Taylor said everything is in place for today's tournament.

With high school and adult divisions, six men's teams and six women's teams will play for prizes donated by local businesses.

"Anyone in the community can stop by," Taylor said. An auction will be open to the public, featuring items donated by local restaurants, hair salons, and the Lancaster Barnstormers. Dinner will be provided by Du'jour Catering and Terre Hill Grill.

Plenty of Andrew Nolt's friends and former teammates will lace up their basketball shoes to play.

"Bull has a competitive spirit. He doesn't give up, (he) plays through it," said Jordan Snader, a Garden Spot grad who had

played baseball and basketball with Nolt since seventh grade. Snader will reunite with a handful of Spartans teammates who all played alongside Nolt.

"I'll be there. I'll bring the family out to show support to the Nolts," said Ryan Landis, Garden Spot's boys varsity basketball coach.

Landis, a teacher at Brecknock Elementary, taught Adam Nolt when he was in elementary school and has made several trips to Johns Hopkins to visit Andrew Nolt.

"The Nolt family just gives so much to people," Landis said. "Now we're looking for ways to help the family."
