Melvin J. Horst

Melvin J. Horst, 79, of Witmer, passed into eternity with the Lord on Wednesday, March 5, 2008, at his residence.



He was born in Brownstown, a son of the late Samuel G. and Elizabeth L. Kern Horst. He married Joanne Thomas in 1953 and together they had five children.

He served in the Korean War with the U.S. Army Signal Corp and graduated from Albright College in 1957.

He was an award-winning professional photographer. His photographs have appeared in Fortune, Life, Time, Better Homes and Gardens, Early American Life and many others. He co-founded Applied Arts Publishing with his longtime friend and mentor, Elmer L. Smith. Together they produced over 40 pictorial booklets focusing on the local Pennsylvania German heritage.

Being the son of an Old Order Horse and Buggy Menonite, he was very familiar with the culture and spoke the PA German dialect. As a result, he could converse comfortably with the Amish and was easily accepted into their society, which enabled him to work from the inside and capture the PA Dutch with a vivid honesty that outside photographers are unable to access.

He designed and built the Folk Craft Center & Museum in Witmer that depicted the Pennsylvania Dutch "way-of-life" via a sound slide film, working craftspersons, gardens and restored 18th and 19th century buildings, which displayed his extensive collections of antiques, tools, folk art and furniture in an authentic village setting. He later turned the historic adjoining family home into a Bed & Breakfast, where he graciously hosted guests,

sharing his extensive knowledge of and love for the Pennsylvania Dutch culture.

Mel also developed his alter ego, "Jakey Budderschnip", of Noodle Doosie, PA, who was heard weekly for many years on WIOV-FM as well as yearly at the Kutztown Folk Festival and at hundreds of private events.

When asked how does all of this fit together, he explained that "All of these facets of my activities fit together perfectly to complete my commitment to photographing, publishing, preserving, and purveying the Pennsylvania Dutch culture."

He will be greatly missed by all those his life touched.

Surviving besides his wife are his children, Deborah A., married to Timothy A. McIntosh of Lima, Peru; Gary D., married to Jan M. Horst of Lititz; Marcia E., married to Hugo F. Bernard Dodd (Barney) Sherer, M.D., a 1940 graduate of Quarryville High School, has died. He was 84.
