"I don't like sheep that much," he said from his sheep pen at the Pennsylvania Farm Show Saturday.

He may not like sheep that much, but they must take to him, as the 15-year-old earned two Master Showmanship awards during the 92nd Farm Show in Harrisburg.

Derek earned the title in both the Market and Junior shows.

While the awards proved his showing ability, his Shropshire ram strutted his stuff Saturday, earning Derek the Grand Champion trophy and putting him in the running for Supreme Grand Champion.

That award went to Olivia Waggoner of Pine Ridge Farm, York. The Supreme Grand Champion Ewe belonged to Christopher MacCauley of Chester County.

Derek, son of Steve Spayd of Hemlock Hollow Farms, Manheim, also earned a first place for his Shropshire yearling ram.

The sheep are always the main attraction on closing day of the weeklong farming expo. Throughout the day in the small arena, sheep and lambs filed into the competition ring and lined up for judging.
