Thalia H. Moshos, 76, of Lancaster, died unexpectedly on Thursday morning June 19, at Lancaster General Hospital.

Born in Lancaster, she was the daughter of the late George D. and Marouka (Vekios) Patounas. Thalia was married to James N. Moshos on the island of Chios in the village of St. George Sikousis, Greece. They celebrated their fifty-sixth wedding anniversary in February.

Thalia was the co-owner of Mama Mia's Pizzeria, North Lime and East James Streets, Lancaster. She and her husband operated Mama Mia's for thirty-two years. Prior to Mama Mia's, Thalia worked at the Apollo Restaurant, which was located at the same location as Mama Mia's, and was owned and operated by her parents.

Thalia was a 1949 graduate of J.P. McCaskey High School. A lifelong, active member of Annunciation Greek Orthodox Church of Lancaster, she sang in the senior choir, volunteered at the annual church bazaar, and was an active member of the Philoptocos Society. Thalia was a former member of Daughters of Penelope.
