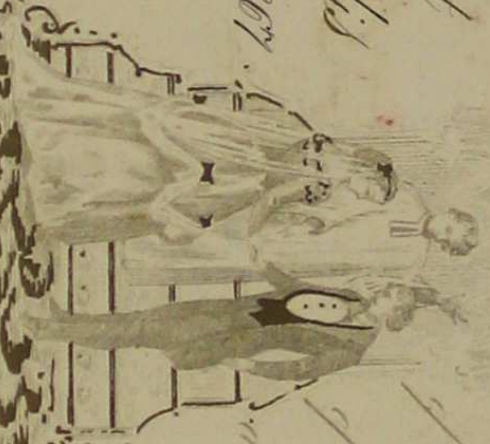

Rev. John B. Landis died at his home, Saturday, Petersburg, aged eighty-two years, death resulting from an intestinal disorder. The deceased was a native of East Lampeter township, and had been a minister of the Mennonite denomination for more than fifty years. The following children survive: Mrs. Martin P. Swarr, Landisville; Mrs. Christian Charles, Rapho; Mrs. John M. Denlinger, Millersville; Mrs. B. F. Charles, East Petersburg; Mrs. D. H. Denlinger, Gap, and Jacob K. Landis, of San Francisco, Cal. The funeral was held from his late home, on Tuesday at 9 a. m. and at 9:30 o'clock at the Petersburg Mennonite Church, where interment was made.
